

# WEATHER click



## 1. Introduction

Weather click carries the **BME280** integrated environmental unit from *Bosch*. It's a sensor that detects humidity, pressure and temperature, specifically designed for low current consumption and long term stability. Those features make it ideal for applications like home automation control, personalized weather stations, sport and fitness tools and so on. *Weather click* can communicate with the target MCU either through mikroBUS<sup>™</sup> SPI or I<sup>2</sup>C interfaces. The board is designed to use a 3.3V power supply.

#### 2. Soldering the headers

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Before using your click board<sup>™</sup>, make sure to solder 1x8 male headers to both left and right side of the board. Two 1x8 male headers are included with the board in the package.





Turn the board upward again. Make sure to align the headers so that they are perpendicular to the board, then solder the pins carefully.



#### 4. Essential features

The BME280 IC has high accuracy and reliability for all three sensors. The humidity sensor has a response time of just one second and it's accurate up to  $\pm 3\%$  RH. The pressure sensor has sensitivity error of  $\pm 0.25\%$  which is equivalent to 1m at 400m height change]. The humidity and pressure sensors can operate independently from each other. Finally, the temperature sensor has a high resolution (up to 20 bit, when IIR filter is enabled) and low noise. The chip has three operating modes: sleep, forced, and normal.



Turn the board upside down so that

the bottom side is facing you upwards.

Place shorter pins of the header into the

appropriate soldering pads.

## 3. Plugging the board in

Once you have soldered the headers your board is ready to be placed into the desired mikroBUS<sup>™</sup> socket. Make sure to align the cut in the lower-right part of the board with the markings on the silkscreen at the mikroBUS<sup>™</sup> socket. If all the pins are aligned correctly, push the board all the way into the socket.
